Fun facts about Clownfish and Sea Anemones

In real life clownfish and anemones have a special relationship. Clownfish are immune to sea anemones' poisonous tentacles. Sea anemones give clownfish protection from predators. They can hide in their tentacles (camouflage)

Clownfish clean sea anemones by eating algae and other food scraps off them.

The scientific name for two animal species helping one another is **symbiosis.**

When two people help each other, we call it caring or friendship.

Activities

Choose one you would to do. You can complete as many as you wish. You do not have to do all the activities.

Materials needed

*Read the sentences from the story
