
## Online Reading Lesson 12 - "Bushfire In The Koala Reserve."

## Access PM Readers

- Read the whole book from beginning to end. Remember, you can click on the "PLAY" button to hear the text read out aloud.
- We're going to ask ourselves some questions about the story.
- And we're going to answer them!
- A great way to think of questions is to ask:
- 1. Is the answer here, (in the book)?
- 2. Is the answer hidden, (clues and hints in the book)?
- 3. Is the answer in our head, (You already know it, or you can come up with a good answer by reading the whole story)?
