

Fire on the Farm



Access PM Readers

- Read chapter one and chapter two. Remember, you can click on the "PLAY" button to hear the text read out aloud.
- We're going to ask ourselves some questions about these chapters.
- We're going to WONDER WHY?
- I think of WONDER WHY'S? As being a bit like predictions except instead of predicting what I think will happen I ask myself "I WONDER WHY?" something in the story has happened.
- The difference with a WONDER WHY is that I might not ever find out the answer, I might just go on wondering.
