# White Ribbon Day



With only four other competitions similar across the state, this places our students in the top 60 public speakers in NSW.



#### **Greek Language Awards**

The Greek Ministry of Education through the Centre for the Greek Language (University of Thessaloniki) holds examinations for the Certificate of Attainment in Greek every year. This certificate is recognised by the Greek government, member states of the European Union and around the world. It is the only recognised certificate that shows proficiency in the Greek language. Sans Souci PS has been participating in these examinations since 2012. Three Sans Souci students participated in 2018, all achieving Distinction. The students are


# In the Spotlight...







