Dear Parents and Carers,

The end of Term 3 has been a busy one for our school and others throughout the state. We're happy to say that together we made it through what has been a constantly-changing and sometimes difficult Term. We could not have done it without the commitment from all of our families who supported learning from home, and from our fantastic teaching and school staff. I want to thank you all for your efforts to continue to keep our school community safe – I know everyone has faced different challenges at different times through the Term. Thank you also for the positive feedback we have received about the support that teachers have provided for students and families.

I hope everyone enjoys a break over the holidays and is looking forward to the COVID-safe return to school from Week 4 in Term 4. Please read through the following updates before the start of the school holidays and don't hesitate to reach out for support or with any questions. A Community Update will be sent to families on the afternoon of Friday October 1.

Learning from Home - Term 4

For the first 3 weeks of Term 4 the school will continue to operate under the guidelines currently in place.

Parents and carers in LGAs of concern must keep children – of all ages, across primary school, secondary school and early childhood education or care – at home unless they cannot be cared for or educated at home. Schools and outside of school hours care (OOSH) services are open for any child that needs it.

This means if you are working from home and your child is able to be educated from home, they must be kept at home to minimise movement in the community.

Our school will be open with minimal supervision to support those students who cannot be educated from home, for example if their parent or carer is an essential worker. All students and families will be supported with learning from home materials and resources provided by your teacher.

For families who are continuing to learn from home, <u>the learning from home page</u> has a wide range of curriculum-based activities to further support your child's learning, if needed.

Thank you again for your understanding and support. We hope you and your family enjoy a safe and very well-deserved break over the holidays. Please take some time over the break to check out our <u>wellbeing resources for students and families</u>. You'll find useful tools for mental health and Term 4 preparation. Please do not hesitate to reach out if we can do anything to help you and your children to prepare for Term 4 or if you have any concerns about the return to school. I will be in touch again soon with further information and any updates for you and your children.

Access to Devices at Home

Families who do not currently have access to a device such as a computer or iPad at home should contact the school office via email for support.

Return to school roadmap for Term 4

In Term 4, where stay-at-home rules are still in place but high community vaccination and low transmission conditions are met, students will return to school in a staggered approach for prioritised cohorts, with no mingling or on-site activities.

Order of return under staggered approach where we remain under stay-at-home rules

Students will return to face-to-face learning with NSW Health-approved COVID-safe <u>Level 3 plus</u> settings on school sites in the following order:

- From 25 October 2021: Kindergarten and Year 1
- From 1 November 2021: Years 2 and 6
- From 8 November 2021: Years 3, 4 and 5.

The return to school roadmap is subject to change depending on new information expected through the Public Health Order and additional advice from NSW Health. You can stay up to date with the most recent advice on our <u>Advice for families page</u>.

\$100 Service NSW Creative Kids Vouchers Eligibility

If you're a parent, carer or guardian, the student will be eligible if they are:

• enrolled in school (from Kindergarten to Year 12, including those who are home-schooled or enrolled in secondary school education at TAFE NSW)

• a current Medicare card holder You can apply for a voucher for each eligible student.

You can use the voucher with approved Creative Kids providers. What you need

- a NSW resident aged between 4.5 and 18 years
- enrolled in school (from Kindergarten to Year 12, including those who are home-schooled or enrolled in secondary school education at TAFE NSW)
- a current Medicare card holder You can apply for a voucher for each eligible student.

You can use the voucher with approved Creative Kids providers. What you need

- a MyServiceNSW account
- one proof of identity document for the parent, carer or guardian
- your child's Medicare card details.
