
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















Sydney East Swimming Carnival at the Homebush Aquatic Centre

SSPS Clean Up

NAPLAN Practice Tests

NAPLAN Practice tests will be available in the online assessment platform from Monday 21 March to Friday 8 April 2022.

Participation in the practice tests is highly beneficial for schools and students in their preparation for NAPLAN. It allows schools and students to become familiar with the online assessment platform and processes. All students at Sans Souci PS will be completing the NAPLAN Practice tests over the next two weeks.

The practice tests include an omnibus test (combination of reading, conventions of language and numeracy questions) and a writing test, both approximately 40 minutes. Students in Years 5 will participate in both tests. Students in Year 3 will participate in the omnibus test only.

Please contact your child's class teacher if you have any questions about this process.

Public Demonstration Site

The public demonstration site helps students understand the types of questions and tools available in the NAPLAN tests. It also provides an opportunity for students to experience the interactive navigation of the online test, try the online tools and make adjustments that may be appropriate for students with disabilities.

Students can access the public demonstration site from the NAP website, which is available all year.

Unlike the real NAPLAN tests, the demonstration tests are not tailored tests and do not include branching between testlets. Example branching messages are included for familiarisation. In NAPLAN online tests, branching messages between testlets advise students if they may go back to previous testlets to change their answers or not.

When accessed through the NAP website, the public demonstration site does not disable browser features such as grammar and spell-check. These features will be disabled during NAPLAN testing.

Touch-typing is not a requirement to successfully complete the writing test. The test window for the official NAPLAN 2022 is 10-20 May 2022.

Check-in assessment for Years 4 & 6

Year 4 & 6 students will participate in a reading and numeracy Check-in assessment. The Check-in assessment is an NSW Department of Education online reading and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor student learning.

The assessments can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.

• The assessment will be scheduled for our Year 4 & 6 students during Week 10 & 11

Students in Year 6 will require headphones or earbuds that connect/plug into their iPads to enable them to hear audio during the assessment.


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
