RAT Kit Distribution

Today all students in attendance were provided with a pack of 5 RAT kits. If your child is a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case in your household but has no COVID-19 symptoms, the tests are to be used each day before your child attends school. Remember that your child should not attend school if the are unwell or are displaying any COVID-19 symptoms. If your child tests positive for COVID-19 and returns to school after the 7-day isolation period, it is recommended that they wear a mask for 3 days after their isolation period has ended. NAPLAN starts on Tuesday 10 May

NAPLAN is a national literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit in May each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students do.

The NAPLAN online test window is nine days.

The NAPLAN online test window starts on Tuesday 10 May and finishes on Friday 20 May 2022.

Students sit assessments in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. Questions assess content linked to the Australian Curriculum: English and Mathematics.

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
