## Multi-Age Classes

- NSW Department of Education groups students into different learning stages in terms of learning achievement. Students have two years to progress through each learning stage.
- All classes are composite in nature and has a diversity of learning ranges.
- Students have the ability to work independently for sustained periods of time.
- Most important factor for student achievement is teacher quality.
- Opportunity to provide students with a more diverse curriculum.
- Tests of academic achievement consistently show either the same, or slightly improved scores, from children in multi-age classes.
- Greater development of interpersonal intelligence.
