Bring Your Own Device Program

Focus:

Student accessing their BYOD work: Google Classroom – used to assign students work and for them to submit completed technology tasks. Students can utilise Google Docs, Slides, Forms and a multitude of learning Apps to present their work.

Bring Your Own Device Program

- BYOD tasks will focus on teacher and peer feedback
- Mathematics - developing and understanding of mathematical language and thinking strategies.
- Writing - developing vocabulary to improve student's writing and comprehension
- Punctuation and grammar
- Other curriculum areas utilising iPad tasks have also been built into History, Science and Literacy units.

Code of Conduct – iPads are to be locked by students in class lockers whenever students are not led by their classroom teachers in a learning activity. **Students are not to message home or other students between 8:45am and 3:15pm.** Mobile phones are also to be locked in lockers throughout the school day. Breaches of the BYOD code of conduct will result in a meeting with Mr Jennings and the immediate loss of BYOD privileges.

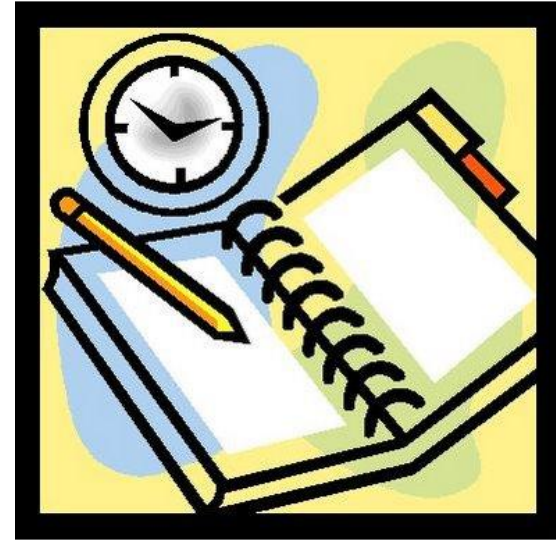

Attendance



Every student. Every day.

- It is important for students to attend school every day - unless they are sick
- A note is required to explain absences - as attendance is compulsory
- For extended absences of 10 or more school days an exemption may be appropriate through the school office
- A late note is required or early leave note from the office between 9:15am and 3:15pm

School Gate Security

The main gate at the front of the school is locked from 9:30am-2:30pm each day. Access the school via the school's rear pedestrian gate. All visitors must report to the school office. In line with current restrictions, only essential visitors are allowed to enter.

Managing Inappropriate Behaviour
